

BACKGROUND:

The Notice Requirements as per By-Law 2007-42 state that the Township will hold a public meeting where written comments and/or verbal comments will be considered during the adoption of the budget.

COMMENTARY:

With the use of technology; administration would like Council to consider the use of Survey Monkey as an additional method of obtaining comments to be considered during the adoption of the budget process.

Historically there has not been a large public turnout during this process. Administration would like to modernize the process by allowing residents to provide input at their leisure from the comfort of their home with hopes of a larger response.

Survey Monkey is an online survey development cloud-based software which manages surveys and provides the results to the subscribed end user. The surveys can be posted on websites and social media sites and available in print.

Administration would provide Survey Monkey with 7-10 questions which the residents would answer; Survey Monkey would then provide administration with the results at the predetermined deadline. These results would then be considered in the same manner as if they were received at the public meeting. If council has any suggestions for

questions to be included in the survey please email me directly. Administration would run the survey from January 27th until February 10th and provide council with the survey results at the regular meeting of council on February 12th.




BACKGROUND:

In March 2015, Council passed Resolution No. 2015-107 to declare surplus the 1981 Bombardier Packer Ski Groomer, Serial # 83190270.

In May 2015, Council considered a staff report identifying that the surplus equipment was advertised for sale throughout the month of April 2015. Although some interest in the groomer was expressed, no bids were received to purchase the equipment.

In November 2019 staff met with a group of local residents to discuss the idea to reconnect the snowmobile trail from Manitouwadge to Marathon and to become affiliated, once again, with the Ontario Federation of Snowmobile Clubs (OFSC). A representative of the Marathon Sno-Kickers Club attended the meeting to provide information related to the proposal. It was determined that a survey should be sent out to the residents of Manitouwadge to gauge interest in the idea of becoming involved in the OFSC trails again; to see if residents were willing to volunteer to clean trails; be part of a board of directors; and, to groom trails.

A survey was developed and was posted on the Municipal website and Facebook pages on December 3, 2019. By December 12, 2019, 117 responses had been collected and

this information was shared with the initial group of interested residents (attached to the report is a summary of the questions and responses).

Based on the survey results, and overwhelming interest in the proposal, a meeting was called to invite local residents to attend to hear more information and commit to volunteer to clean trails over the months of December and January.

A subsequent meeting was held on January 9, 2020 and the next meeting is scheduled for January 29, 2020.

A portion of the proposed trail will utilize the old Rail Bed, now owned by Northern Broadband. A Memorandum of Understanding has been signed between Northern Broadband and the Marathon Sno-Kickers Club. This information has been provided to the OFSC to list the trail on their trail network as "closed" in order for clearing and grooming to take place.

If the snowmobile trail from Manitouwadge to Marathon is accepted as an official trail with OFSC, they will provide a trail groomer, at their expense, to maintain the trails to OFSC standards.

COMMENTARY:

An Offer to Purchase has been received from Dan Kelly, on behalf of the local snowmobile group, to purchase the surplus Ski Hill groomer for local use. The groomer has not been used in over five years. A replacement groomer was budgeted in 2014, purchased in the amount of \$75,000, is currently in use at Kiwissa Ski Hill and is in a good state of repair.

It is proposed that the local members will repair the surplus groomer at their own expense and utilize it to groom local trails.

In the event that the new ski hill groomer is out of commission, for any reason, it is the understanding that the surplus groomer can be used by the Township to maintain the ski hill to ensure no interruption to the ski hill operation.

It is the sincere desire of the snowmobile group that the groomer will remain in Manitouwadge for the benefit of local residents.

FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS:

The offer made for the surplus equipment is in the amount of \$1.

Local volunteers are currently looking at the surplus groomer to assess and estimate costs of repair.

Please accept this letter as an offer to purchase the surplus Skil Hill Groomer from the Township of Manitowadge for \$1.


A local group of volunteers are currently working with the Marathon Sno-Kickers Snowmobile Trail Club to re-establish the OFSC trails from Manitowadge to Hwy 17. We expect to have a trail designated as "closed" with OFSC this winter to allow the volunteers to clean up the trail in order that a groomer, on loan from the Marathon club, can groom the trail this winter.

The local volunteers propose to purchase the ski hill groomer from the Township of Manitowadge for the purpose of grooming local snowmobile trails to popular local fishing lakes outside of the OFSC trails. This will allow local residents, who do not wish to purchase an OFSC permit, to access their favourite fishing spots without penalty.

In addition, once the local groomer is repaired, at our expense, it can be used by the Municipality to groom the Kiwissa Ski Hill in the event the current groomer is out of service.

We hope you will consider our offer to purchase and look forward to your prompt reply.

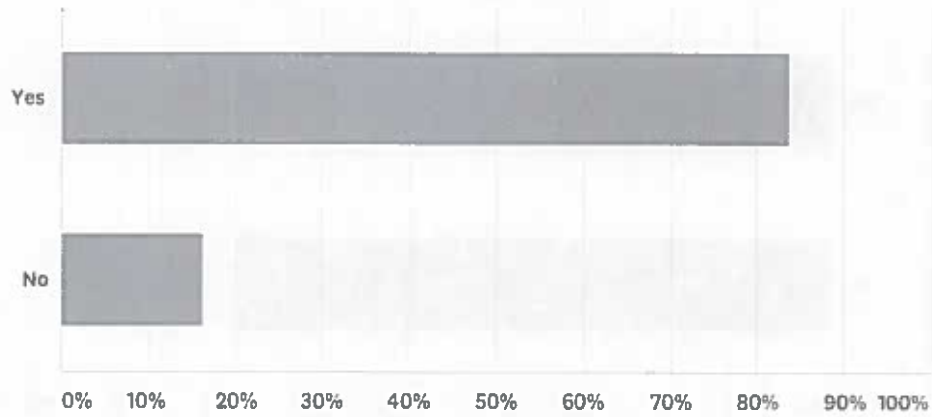

Q1 Do you currently own a snowmobile?

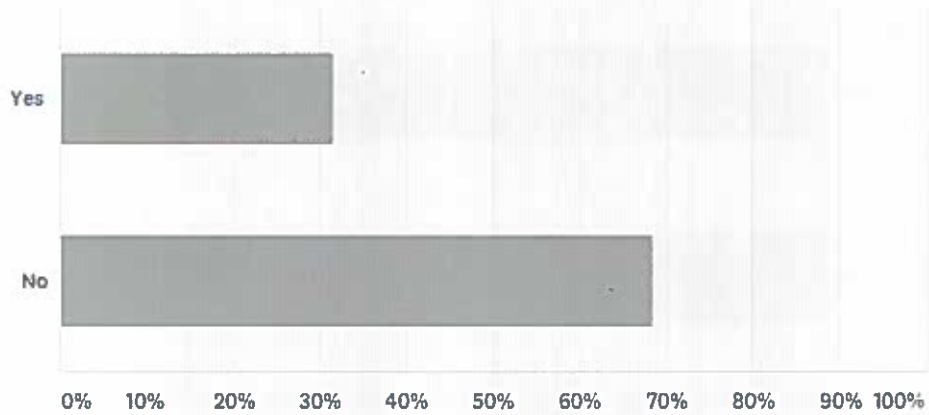

Q2 Do you plan on purchasing a snowmobile in the next 12 months?

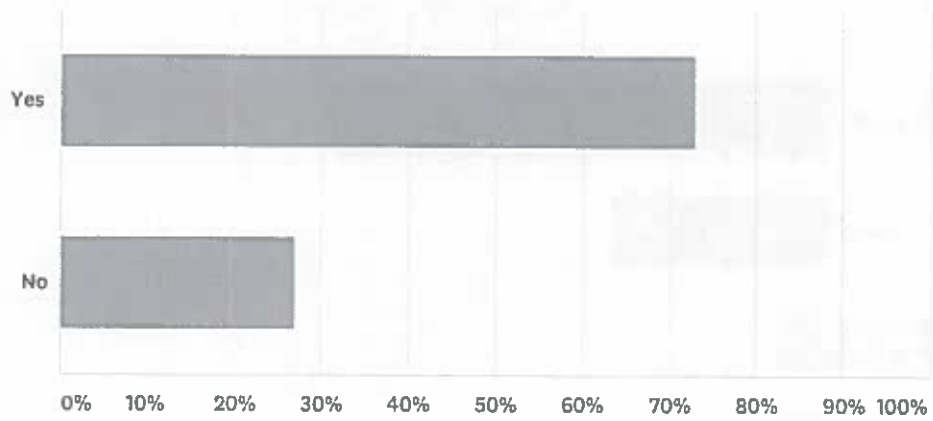

Q3 Have you ever purchased a OFSC permit in the past?

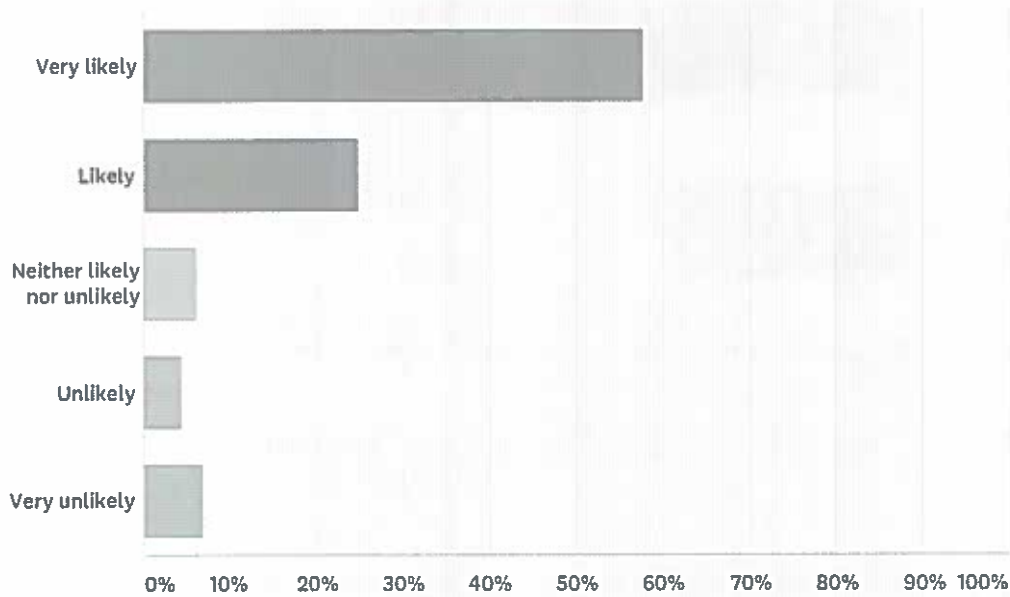

Q4 If an OFSC trail network were to be established, how likely would you be to purchase a trail permit?

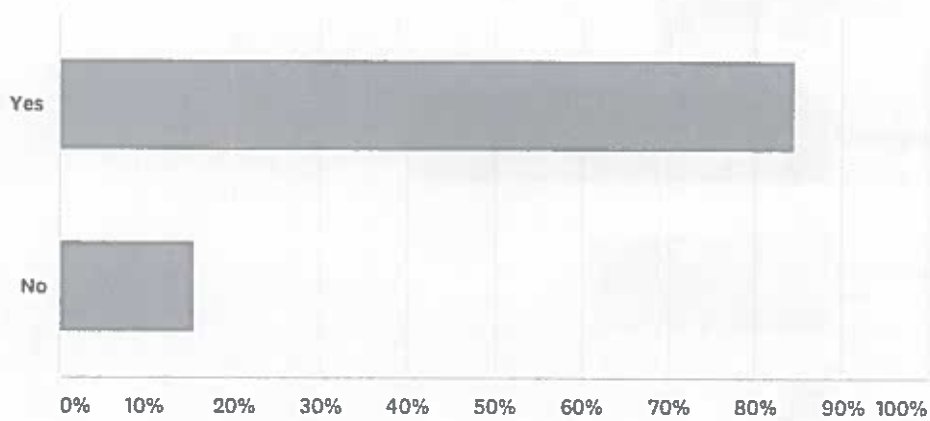

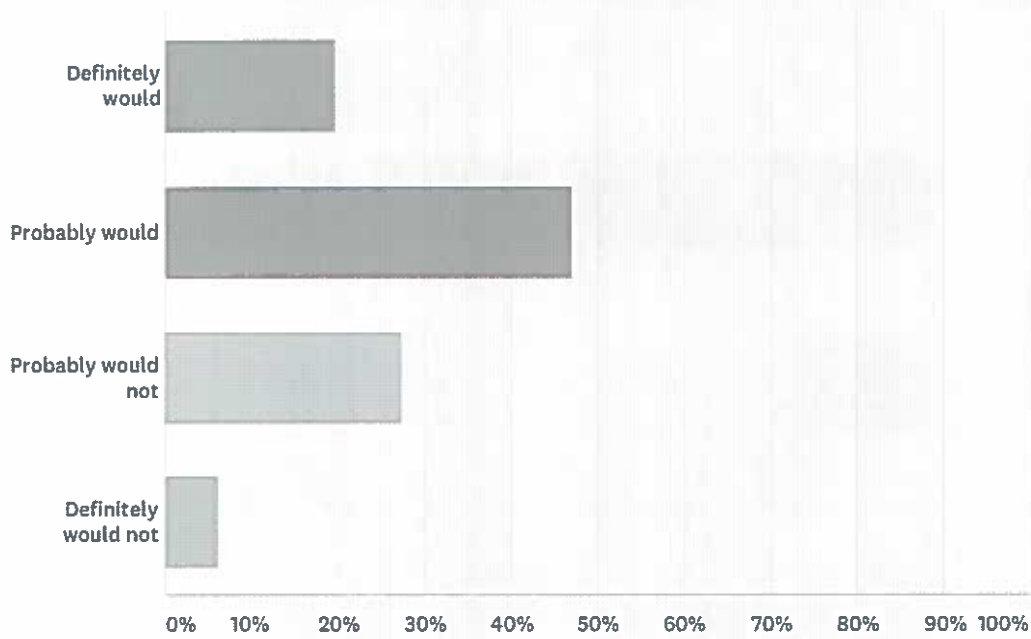

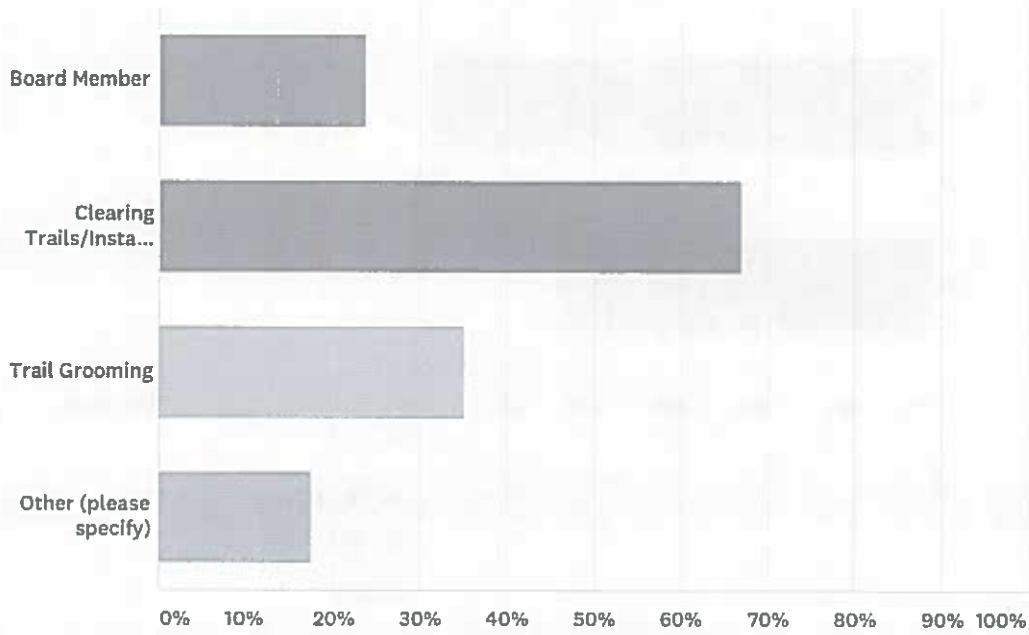

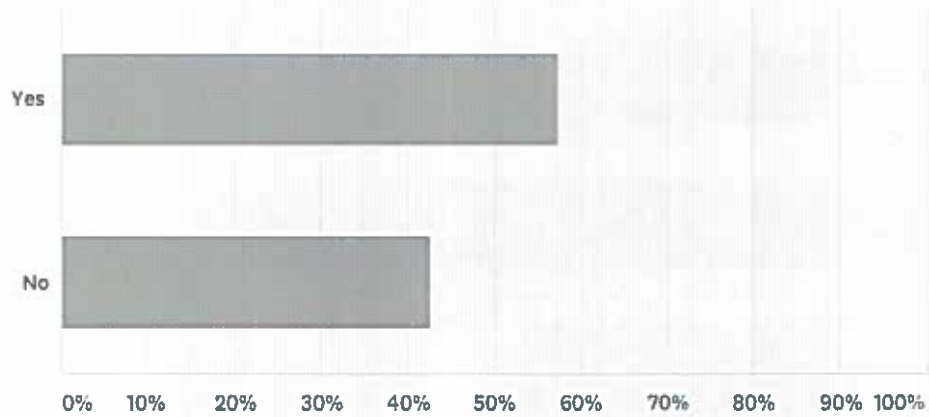

Q8 Would you be interested in attending the next planning meeting?

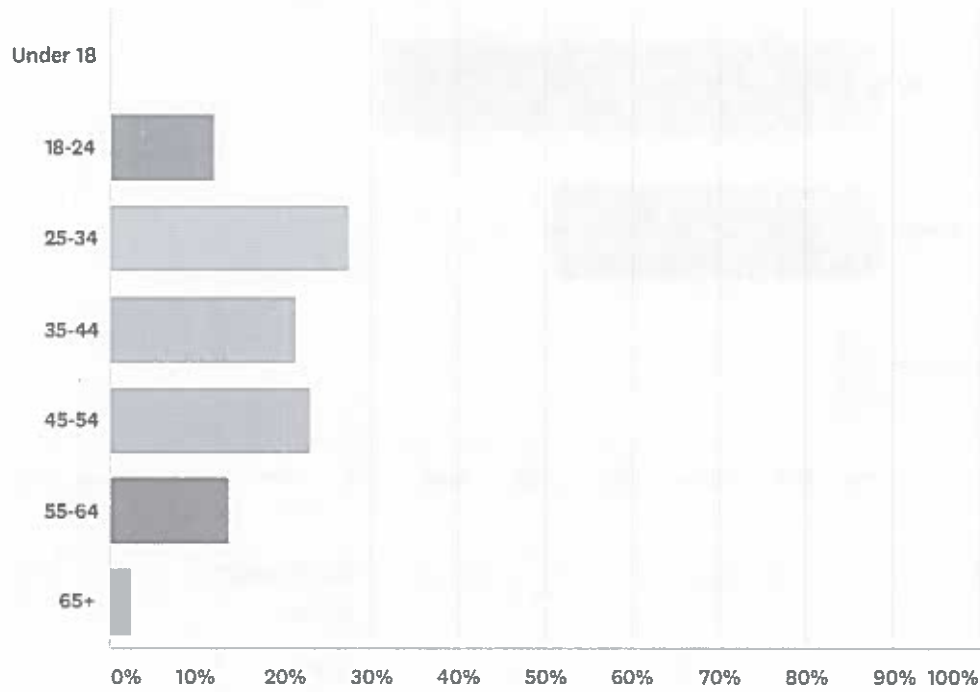

Q9 What is your age range?

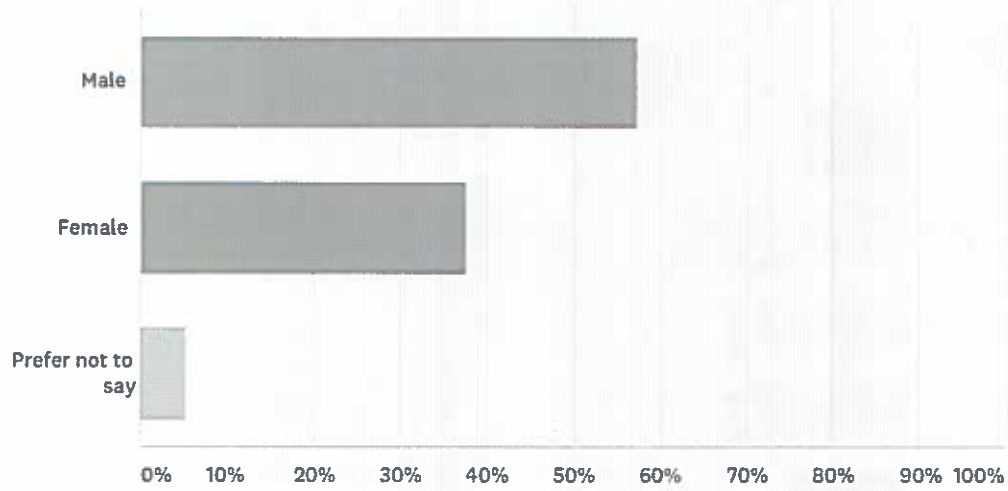
