EVEN GOOD DOGS HAVE BAD DAYS

The Manitouwadge Township Protective Services Department is very concerned about the number of biting incidents in the past few weeks. One incident involved a young child, two others were adults and two others were from dogs being off their leash attacking other dogs on a leash. These are the incidents that have been reported however, there are several other incidents that this department is aware of but haven't been officially reported. Examples of this are dogs running out on the street barking and chasing people on foot or on bicycle, no bites occurring, but they are scaring people.

Manitouwadge By-Law 2019-17 states:

- 4.3- No owner of a dog or cat shall cause, allow or permit a dog or cat, he or she owns, to be at large within the Municipality.
 - 4.3(2)- No owner shall permit a dog or cat to be at large that is not under the effective control of a responsible person.
 - 4.3(3) When not within the dwelling unit or on the premises of its owner or on private property with the consent of the owner of that private property, every owner shall ensure that all dogs and cats are:
 - a) on a leash;
 - b) on a leash of not more than two (2) meters in length;
 - c) on a leash held under the effective control of a responsible person.
- Fine range from \$150 to a court appearance with a maximum of \$5,000.

Proceedings — Part IX of the Provincial Offences Act

Are you a responsible dog owner?

A dog's guardian is responsible for preventing bites. If your dog bites someone, you can be prosecuted under the Dog Owners' Liability Act. This can result in a fine, restrictions on your dog's freedom, or even a death sentence for your dog.

Please keep your dog under control.
