Household Garbage Containers

The Public Works Department purchased a new garbage truck last year, replacing the old unit that was 19 years old.

The new truck has a bin lifter on the rear of the truck. These large garbage bins with wheels may be purchased to hold all of your household garbage.

With the use of these garbage containers, household garbage may go into one container and be rolled to the curb on large 8" wheels, thus, eliminating the need to carry multiple standard garbage cans to the roadside.

What is the Ontario Building Code Act?

The Building Code Act, 1992 is the legislative framework governing the construction, renovation and the change-of-use of a building. The Ontario Building Code is a provincial regulation under the Act that establishes detailed technical and administrative requirements as well as minimum standards for building construction.

The purposes of the Ontario Building Code

include; public health and safety, fire protection, resource conservation, environmental integrity and accessibility; although its primary purpose is the promotion of public safety through the application of appropriate uniform building standards. The Ministry of Municipal Affairs and Housing is responsible for the development of, and the amendments to the Building Act and

Code. The Ministry may be contacted at its website:
