ADMINISTRATION REPORT

Two questions were asked on the survey:

1. The 2021 Municipal Operating Budget has been calculated with a tax levy that is 11% less than the 2020 Municipal Operating Budget. For a rate payer with a home valued at \$50,000 this equates to a savings of approximately \$400 from last year. Are you in support of the savings proposed?
 - 12 visitors answered Q. 1 with the following results:
 - 9 respondents "Yes", being 75%
 - 1 respondent "No", being 8.3%
 - 2 respondents "Unsure", being 16.7%

2. The 2021 Municipal Operating Budget proposes to complete approximately \$2 million in capital works projects. The specific projects are outlined on page 9 of the June 30, 2021 presentation to Council. Are you in support of the identified Capital Projects?
 - 12 visitors answered Q. 2 with the following results:
 - 8 respondents "Yes", being 66.7%
 - 0 respondents "No", being 0%
 - 4 respondents "Unsure", being 33.3%

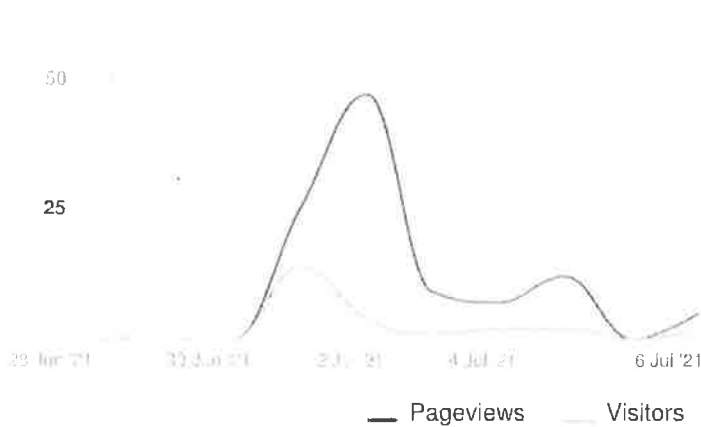

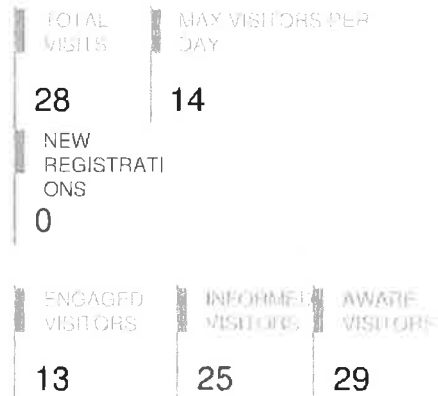
MyManitouwadge 2021 Municipal Operating Budget

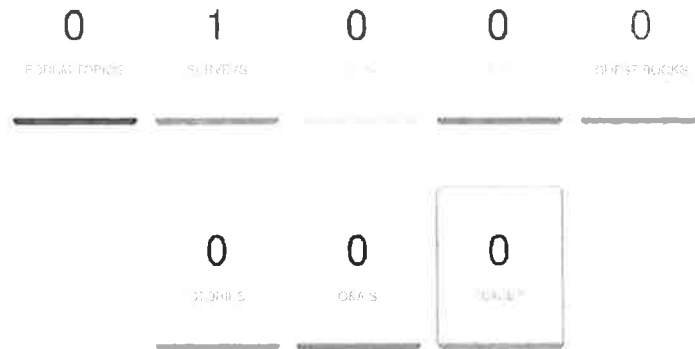

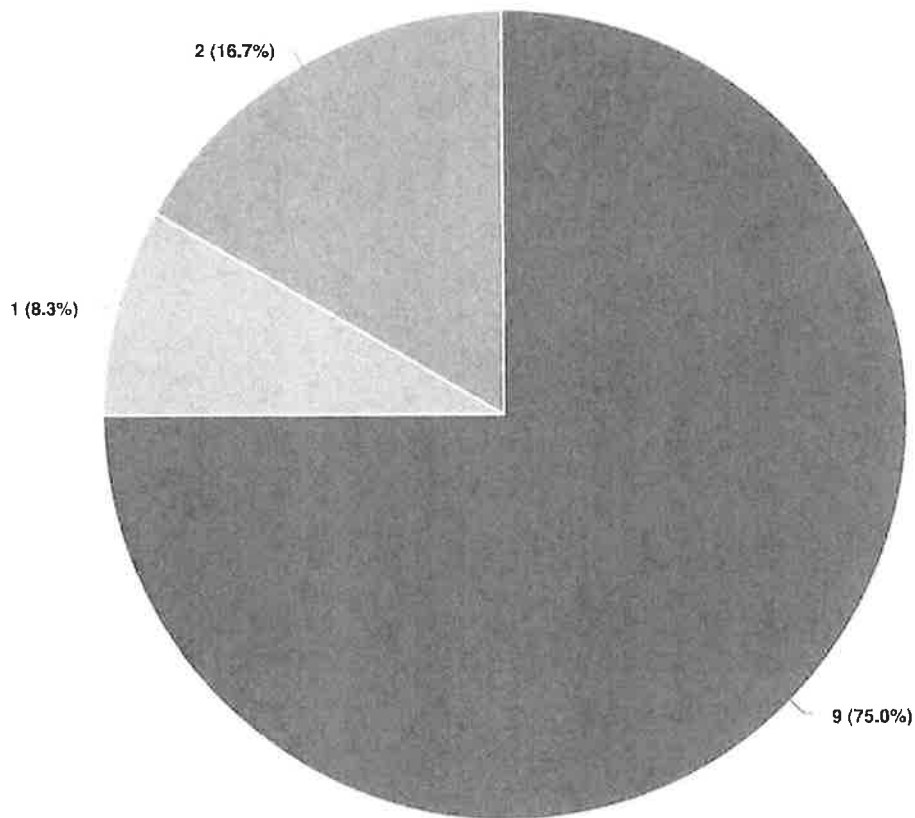

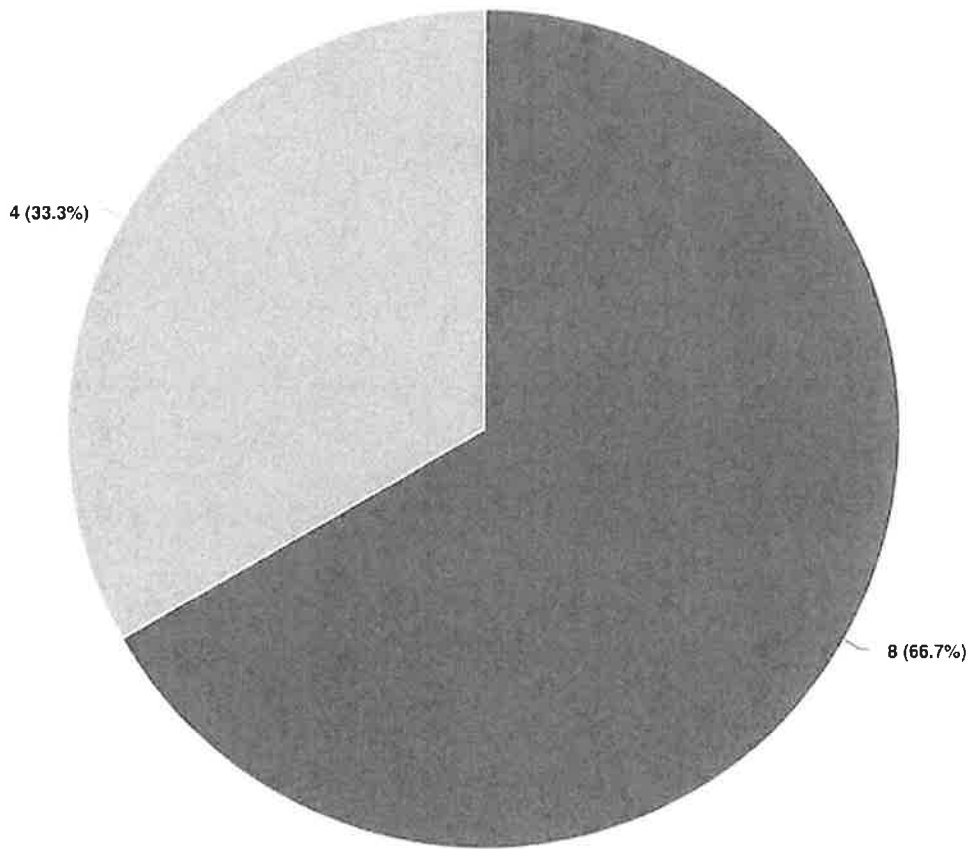

Without having any information about the budget, expenses for operations is unknown. Given past practices, is it still necessary to provide so much funding to the Library Board when COVID-19 has deterred services of the library? Also, with the new age of technology, the use of a library is now becoming history. Information can be sourced easily and readily, and the abundant amount of resources available puts to question: Is the Library really needed? Given the services that they do provide with respect to copying/faxing of documents this can be conducted at the Employment Centre. The Employment Centre can be re-located to where the library is and use of computers for the public remain provided. This would eliminate great costs to the ratepayers (I.e.: labour and training, insurance, litigations, etc.) as this would be the responsibility of the Employment Centre, which in turn will lessen the tax burden. The conversion to office space for employment services, job search and training, etc. becomes a multi-faceted operation. By closing the doors to the Library, ratepayers will save about \$100,000+ per year and eliminate the duplication of services provided in our community. In addition, rental income can be generated, instead of being a liability to ratepayers. Also, this will free up office space at the Hallmark Square for other businesses to start up operations or expand.
